















Protected Characteristics: Story Book Spine

We promote the Protected Characteristics. The Equality Act 2010 protects everyone in Britain from discrimination, harassment and victimisation. Under the Act there are 9 characteristics: age, disability, gender re-assignment, race, religion or belief, marriage or civil partnership, sex, sexual orientation, pregnancy and maternity. We actively promote these through the curriculum.
