



Know two examples from different world views; identify what they have in common. Know three or more key Christian beliefs. Know and understand what matters to Christians Know the main beliefs about of Muslims and Hindus about God. Know why the worship of Allah/Brahman matters to Muslims and Hindus. Know about the value of sacred space and holy buildings to believers in at least two religions.	Now about the impact of beliefs about sacred writings, God and values.
